Drought problems in Malawi

Food has been sent to relieve the drought problems in Malawi. One problem, the moslem president is only giving this aid to the moslems or people who will become moslems in return for the aid, this leaves Christians without food including the community I worked with.

It cost's £20 to feed a family of 4, that is £5.00 per month per person. That would cost £1,000 per month to feed the whole community of 2 000 people living in 500 families in mud huts, or £500 per month to feed them on half rations that would keep them from dying

December is mango season so all is cared for until Jan. In Jan they can pick more edible leaves which look like spinach soup when cooked, but not sufficient to stay alive on. They grind reed stalk's to sawdust for bulk, no other food stuff is available until the end of March when they will harvest the crop of maize for the year drying it out in the sun, ending the famine Any help on how to raise money to feed this community for the three months would be very helpful to me. I have already given Duncan £150 for his family and very urgent needs from the community. His account number will be given to anyone able to

Please help me to keep these new Christians alive. They have not asked for food or money, but my eyes could see their desperate need and the rejoicing when I supplied the community with three days of food, though they did not ask, they pray to the Lord to supply their need, that is all. There is no work. Many have cycled to Mozambique to help with the now over harvest in return for food. Now they can only wait for their own harvest's

554 people have become Christians last week. They immediately prayed for rain, and the Lord answered their prayer within the hour
