Other orphan schools we started continue in Kenya, India and Pakistan. Bible School work is also continuing unsupported in India, Burma, Thailand and a few different countries in Africa. The rest we still support.

Since Christmas we have also seen both a rise in support as well as in results. We would like to thank all of you for such faithful support, even during this time of Lockdown.

## **EXCITING RADIO CHURCH WORK**

Lockdown is in Sierra Leone as well causing the people to have no church to go to. With few facilities for life streaming etc, they asked me if I would conduct "Radio Church," complete with Holy communion to the thousands of churches, denominations and people of their country during lockdown. I joyfully accepted and soon did it for the country of Liberia as well. The radios did extra advertising for these radio church services and asked the people to prepare the own Holy Communion which they would take together in unity with us at the right moment over radio in their homes. All this is done via Whats App from Standlake Ranch, England.

## **EASTER WEEKEND**

This presented a new challenge as to how to make it special. After prayer I knew. I read some wonderful prophecies from the Old Testament with the Shofar sounding in the background, went onto Jesus coming with the Kingdom of Heaven and how dying on the cross and rising from the dead made it possible for us to receive Christ and the Kingdom of Heaven into our lives as well. I then led them through the sinner's prayer and gave communion. Mandy then sang "He Is Risen" over the main line phone. The people loved it. ## SCOTT & ANGELA LILLIE'S TRIP TO UGANDA

Greetings all!



Scott and I have just returned from an incredible ten days in Uganda visiting Step Out In Faith Bible Schools. What a truly amazing experience! A team of three leaders (Geoffrey, Pastor Shaphat and Pastor Christopher) met us at the airport and accompanied us for the nine day experience of a life time! We began by visiting the church of Pastor Shaphat in Entebbe. The villages were so warm and welcoming, They received Scott's message with open hearts. Many came forward for prayer and ministry. The worship was so full of the Holy Spirit! We visited numerous homes of especially poor widows in the village, delivering soap, face cloths and supplies.

We journeyed on over rough red dirt roads where we observed hundreds of kilometres of poverty. Most people lived in very small dark mud brick huts with no electricity or running water. Children often had jiggers (mites) in their fingers and toes from the dust that is so prevalent in their homes. These can fester and become very painful. At Kibaale School Olivia was helping a child by digging these mites out and treating the wound.

Upon arrival at Kasana school we were greeted by more than a hundred children singing songs of welcome even though it was Saturday! Children, parents and staff were so grateful for all Step Out in Faith had accomplished in their school. Scott and I both shared in the Kasana church (part of the school) on Sunday. I loved joining in their exuberant African dance of praise! The little mud building was crammed full of men, women and children hungry to hear the word of God. Mamas fed babies on their laps while children sat in the dirt at the front. Sweat poured off everyone as we jumped, hollered and danced for joy before the Lord!
